



The management of symptoms of illness, chronic illness, infectious disease in a child in the preschool.

Proceedings in case of a child's symptoms of illness.

1. Parents bring to the preschool **ONLY** children who are healthy. A **RUNNY NOSE IS ALSO AN ILLNESS**.
2. In case of infections, skin diseases, infectious diseases and after injuries (fractures, surgery and others) the child may not be brought to the preschool. surgery, etc.) the child may not attend preschool until he/she is completely healed.
3. Parents are obliged to report any serious ailments and infectious or parasitic diseases of the child to the teacher or the management. The teacher has a duty to inform the other parents of the situation and to draw attention to worrying symptoms in children.
4. When a child complains of headache, earache, increased body temperature, vomiting and other disturbing symptoms constituting health discomfort and which may be a symptom of a developing disease, the teacher will notify the parents, ask the parents to collect the ill child from the preschool and recommend a medical consultation.
5. At the time of collecting a child from the preschool, the teacher shall provide parents with information on the child's worrying mood or noticed changes in the child's behaviour during his/her stay at the preschool.
6. In the event that parents are unable to collect their child in person, they may authorise another person - in accordance with the "Procedure for bringing and collecting children".
7. The teacher is not obliged to provide health services. This task concerns the doctor, nurse or paramedic. A teacher entrusted with the safety, health and life of a child should be aware of his/her responsibility. Therefore, he or she must bear in mind that first aid on his or her part is only an emergency, temporary assistance before a professional and qualified medical force arrives.
8. In emergency conditions (loss of consciousness, fainting and syncope, fractures, hemorrhages, dislocations, injuries, foreign bodies in the nose, throat, eye, ear, bites and stings, burns and frostbite, poisoning), when the child's health condition requires immediate medical intervention, then the teacher or another preschool employee is obliged to provide pre medical assistance to the extent of their skills and call an ambulance. At the same time, the teacher or preschool principal will notify the child's parents of the situation.
9. Until the ambulance arrives or the parents arrive, the child remains in the care of a teacher, director or other staff member of the preschool.
10. The ambulance doctor decides on further assistance to be provided to the child (possibly transporting the child to hospital) - a protocol is drawn up. If the child's parents do not

arrive on time, the teacher or caretaker taking care of the child goes with the child to the hospital and waits there for the parents to arrive.

Infectious disease:

1. Parents are obliged to inform the preschool immediately of an infectious disease in their child.
2. The Director is obliged to inform the parents in the event of an infectious disease in the preschool.
3. In the case of notification of a contagious disease, the staff members are obliged to wash the furniture and toys with antibacterial and disinfecting agents.
4. Further action in such a situation is taken by the Director in accordance with the guidelines of the Sanitary Inspectorate.
